New Jersey Peach Council

The New Jersey Peach Council has been testing varieties of peaches from the Rutgers New Jersey Agricultural Experiment Station (NJAES) for the past 90 years. Originally formed as a committee of the New Jersey State Horticultural Society in 1898 it was later incorporated as an independent organization. Advanced selections are propagated and tested by grower trustees of the Council and other organizations, and the best selections are propagated and named by the Council. The role of the Council has changed in recent years with the advent of plant protection, whereby Adams County Nursery (formerly the official propagator) now the exclusive licensee of all NJAES peach selections, and the New Jersey Peach Council is relegated to testing and variety information. The NJPC had been a long-term financial supporter of the NJAES breeding program and other peach testing programs in New Jersey.

John I. Rigolizzo, Sr. Passes


