Former Middlesex County Ag. Agent, Warner H. Thurlow, Died on September 15, 2018 at 93

For 32 years, Warner served as County Agricultural Agent for Middlesex County, where he was responsible for adult education programs for County residents. He was noted especially for his work advising homeowners on landscaping and gardening problems, and worked closely with commercial nurseries, landscaping businesses, and public agencies. He also regularly hosted gardening programs on radio station WCTC, in New Brunswick, NJ.

Warner was an old-school county ag agent. He was a generalist and a servant to all. He was predeceased by his first wife, Ruth (Gruner), his second wife, Amelia (Hamilton), and his son-in-law, Timothy Meaney. He is survived by his third wife of 25 years, Jean (Walker), his daughter, Marjorie Meaney, son and daughter- in-law, Ernest and Joanne Thurlow, and several grandchildren to whom he was affectionately known as "Pop": Scott Thurlow, Breanne Meaney, Caitlin and her husband Ryan Lormel, and a great-grandson Ryan Timothy Lormel,

Born in Newark, Warner grew up in Spring Lake and graduated from Manasquan High School. After serving in the <u>U.S. Navy</u> during <u>WWII</u>, he enrolled at Rutgers University, receiving a Bachelor of Science in Agriculture and later a Master of Science Degree.

Warner served on the Board of Directors of the Middlesex County Tuberculosis & Health League, was Chief Financial Officer of the American Lung Association of Mid-Jersey, and, for more than 30 years, served on the Board of Directors of the American Lung Association of New Jersey.

He was a parishioner of Pinelands Reformed Church, Toms River, where he served as a deacon, elder, and vice president. A proud veteran, he was a member of the Tin Can Sailors, the National Association of Destroyer Veterans, and the USS O'Hare DD-DDR 889.

To his entire family, Warner "Pop" Huntington Thurlow will forever live in our memory, a stalwart figure of life, wisdom, and light, who never failed to remind us that simply gathering together to share is, in and of itself, sublime, and something always to be celebrated.

E. Randall Miller, Delaware Valley College Graduate, Passed Away September 26, 2018




